

My wife considered sending an email to all our friends and relatives saying "We have decided not to celebrate Christmas this year. We are going to celebrate the birth of Jesus instead". I can see where she is coming from; Christmas has been hijacked. And I don't want to totally spoil your festivities by pointing out that Jesus was not born in December. He was most likely born around the end of September, but people did not know that when they started celebrating Christmas over a thousand years ago, and I don't think anyone is going to change the date now. Just for interest, for geeks like me, the evidence for a.... September birth is fourfold; chronological, theological, astronomical... and agricultural. The CHRONOLOGICAL argument centres on when Zacharias went into the temple, and his wife Elizabeth became pregnant with John the Baptist. In the sixth month of Elizabeth's pregnancy, Gabriel visited Mary with the announcement that she would give birth to Jesus. The supposed month of Jesus' birth can, therefore, be estimated by calculating from the date of Zacharias' clerical duty until the birth of Jesus. Which points to September. The THEOLOGICAL argument says that there were three main Jewish festivals; Passover, Pentecost & Tabernacles. Jesus being a man of occasions was crucified at Passover, poured out the Holy Spirit at Pentecost... and so maybe the other significant event in His life, His birth, should have occurred at Tabernacles, which is late September. The ASTRONOMICAL argument is based on the journey of the 3 wise men who followed the 'star of Bethlehem'. There are long and interesting discussions online about the "King planet" Jupiter... coronating the "King star" Regulus and the constellation Virgo rising with the moon beneath her feet in 3 BC, and how this can be seen as foretelling the birth of a great King in September. The AGRICULTURAL evidence is - there were 'shepherds in the fields looking after their flocks'. But sheep are brought in from the fields in Winter. Joseph and Mary travelled to Bethlehem for a Roman census – this would not have been called in December... but would likely have been called in - September which was a less intensive month for an agricultural society. All very interesting, but does it matter? The Queen of England has two birthdays each year. The day on which she was born celebrated privately, and her official birthday when everyone celebrates and gives gifts. I have always thought that if the Queen of England can have two birthdays then surely the King of kings can have two birthdays. His real birthday, and His official birthday in December when we all celebrate and give gifts.

We will celebrate Christmas this year with turkey and stuffing, baked potatoes and parsnips, brussel sprouts, carrots, gravy, bread sauce, and followed by mince pies, Christmas pud, brandy butter, Christmas cake and cheese (possibly not all at one sitting). We will play silly games with the children. But behind it all we will remember "the reason for the season". The birth of Jesus, Son of man, Son of God, the saviour of the world. Wishing you all a peaceful and joyful Christmas.

CHRISTMAS REFLECTION In 1741, when he was 65 years old, Handel composed his sacred Oratario... the Messiah.... the story of Jesus Christ. He completed the entire work in 24 days. He said the music just seemed to pour out of him - as if God Himself was composing the music. During that time Handel hardly went out. His man-servant would bring him his meals on a tray - only to find the previous meal still uneaten.

After composing the glorious Halleluia Chorus, with tears in his eyes Handel told his servant, "I saw all heaven before me - and the great God Himself." At it's London premier at Covent garden Opera House... it was so magnificent that when the Halleluia Chorus was reached, King George the second spontaneously rose to his feet in admiration and awe, carried away by the heavenly music and singing. The entire audience stood up also (because of the King) throughout the playing of the Halleluia Chorus, where the choir sang from Revelation... the last book in the Bible:

"For the Lord God Omnipotent reigneth. The kingdoms of this world have become the Kingdoms of our Lord and of His Christ... and He shall reign for ever and ever, King of Kings and Lord of Lords... Halleluia."

And so, while we all might applaud Handel's wonderful music, which is a true masterpiece, let's not forget the source of his inspiration, the person of Jesus Christ - our Messiah - and Saviour and Friend, who was born in a stable at Bethlehem over 2,000 years ago. Jesus who said, "I am the light of the world - those who follow me shall never walk in darkness, but shall have the Light of Life." He is the one that Christmas is all about !!
